

2026 Toyota AFL Finals Series

Junior & Concession Policy - MCG

The following Junior and Concession Policy applies to the sale of daily public ticketing during the 2026 Toyota AFL Finals Series.

TOYOTA AFL FINALS SERIES (Wildcard Finals, Qualifying Finals, Elimination Finals, Semi Finals, Preliminary Finals)

Junior Policy – Public Reserve

- Children aged 4-14 as at 1 January 2026 are eligible to purchase a junior ticket.
- Children aged 3 and under as at 1 January 2026 are entitled to enter the ground at no charge; however, they must not occupy a seat.
- Persons aged 15 and over as at 1 January 2026 are classified as an adult, unless they hold valid Concession identification.

During the member pre-sale, Competing Club members are required to purchase a finals ticket that is equivalent to the type of membership that they hold (i.e. adult membership can only purchase an adult finals ticket).

Junior Policy – AFL Reserve (applicable to Guest Passes)

- Children aged 4-16 as at 1 January 2026 are eligible to purchase a junior guest ticket.
- Children aged 3 and under as a 1 January 2026 are entitled to enter the ground at no charge with a ticketed AFL Member, however they must not occupy a seat.
- Persons aged 17 and over as at 1 January 2026 are classified as an adult, unless they hold valid Concession identification.

Junior Policy – MCC Members' Reserve (applicable to Visitor Tickets)

For all MCC Members' Reserve events an adult is classified as 17 years and over as of the day of the event, while a child is classified as under 17 years as of the day of the event. Children under seven are considered free of charge providing they are accompanied by an adult and do not occupy a seat.

Concession Policy – Public Reserve and AFL Reserve (applicable to Guest Passes)

A person must have the appropriate form of concession to purchase a concession ticket. They must present the relevant concession documentation at point of purchase and upon entry to the ground. A second form of identification (e.g. drivers' licence, Medicare card, credit card) may be requested when purchasing or utilising a concession ticket to verify the concession entitlement.

Patrons holding one of the following cards are eligible to purchase a ticket at the concession rate;

- Centrelink issued: Pensioner Concession Card (PCC)*
- Department of Veterans' Affairs card or Department of Veterans' Affairs issued Pensioner Concession Card*
- Full time secondary or tertiary student cards^
- Centrelink issued: Health Care Card (HCC)*.

*Note: Cardholders only (not their dependants listed on the card) are entitled to the concession price.

^Note: Does NOT apply to international Student Cards.

Companion Cards

The AFL is a National Affiliate of the Companion Card program and agree to provide an admission ticket for the cardholder's companion at no charge. The Companion Card program is applicable at all AFL Venues.

TOYOTA AFL GRAND FINAL

There is no junior price for the Toyota AFL Grand Final.

Children aged 4-14 as at 1 January 2026 are eligible to purchase a Concession ticket. Children aged 3 and under as at 1 January 2026 are entitled to enter the ground at no charge with a ticketed guardian; however, they must not occupy a seat.

Persons aged 15 and over as at 1 January 2026 are classified as an adult, unless they hold valid concession identification.
